NEW ZEALAND

(1) Extradition Act 1999

(1) The Extradition Act 1999, which came into force on 1 September 1999, modernises New Zealand's extradition law by replacing the Extradition Act 1965 (which dealt with extradition to non-Commonwealth countries) and the Fugitive Offenders Act 1881 (which dealt with extradition to Commonwealth countries) with a single statute. The Act contains three procedures for requesting the surrender of individuals from New Zealand and also details the procedure for surrendering persons to New Zealand.

The main regime, contained in Part 3 of the 1999 Act, applies to countries with an extradition treaty with New Zealand, certain Commonwealth countries and other countries to whom the Part is applied by Order in Council.

The 'endorsed warrants' regime, contained in Part 4 of the Act, applies to extradition between New Zealand and Australia. It may also apply to designated countries to whom the Part is applied by Order in Council, although there have yet to be any countries designated in this manner. It provides a fast track extradition procedure between New Zealand and countries with comparable extradition arrangements. It differs from the main regime both in terms of the standard of evidence required and the roles of the Court and the Minister of Justice.

Requests from non-Commonwealth countries may also be made on an ad hoc basis under Part 5 of the Act where there is no extradition treaty with New Zealand, or where there is a treaty but the relevant offence is not an extradition offence under that treaty. Part 5 then stipulates that the Minister of Justice must decide if the request should be granted, having regard to certain factors in section 60 of the 1999 Act. If so, the procedure contained in Part 3 applies to the particular request.
